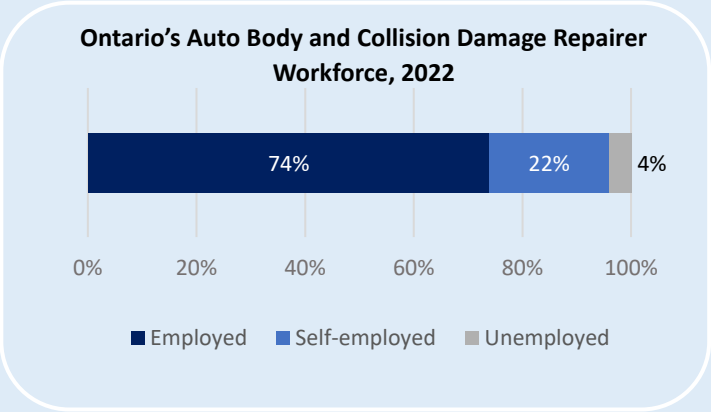


Auto Body and Collision Damage Repairer (310B)

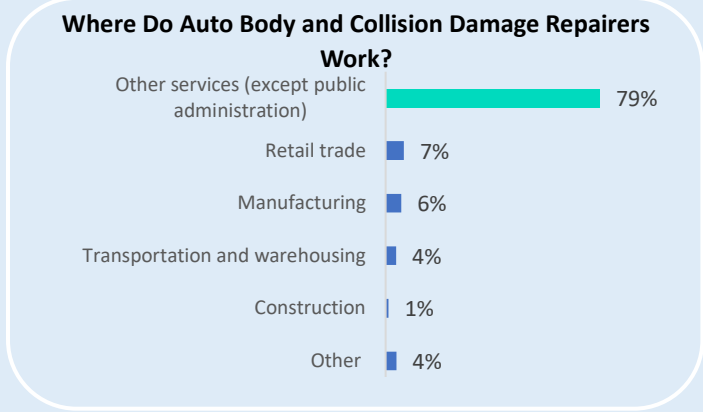


Auto Body and Collision Damage Repairers¹ repair and restore damaged motor vehicle body parts and interior finishing. They restore a vehicles's interior components, electric components as well passanger seat belts and air bags. Other duties may include aligning and replacing steering and suspension components. 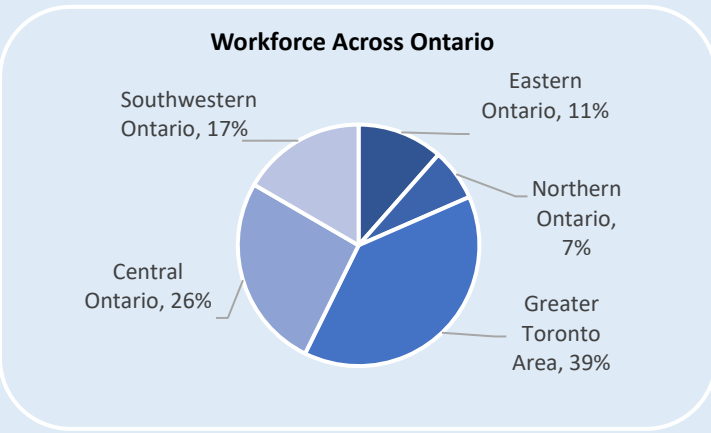

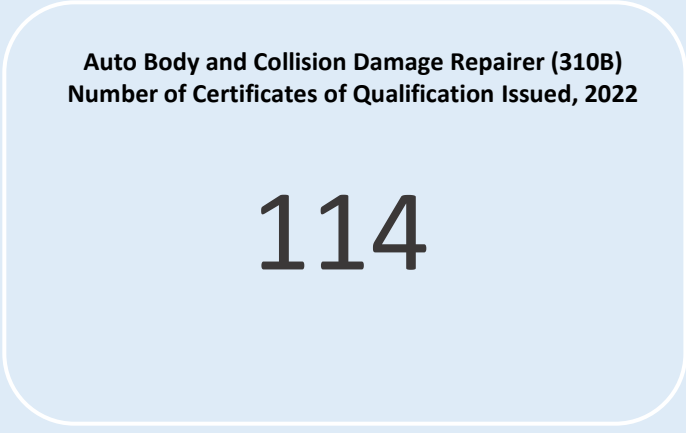

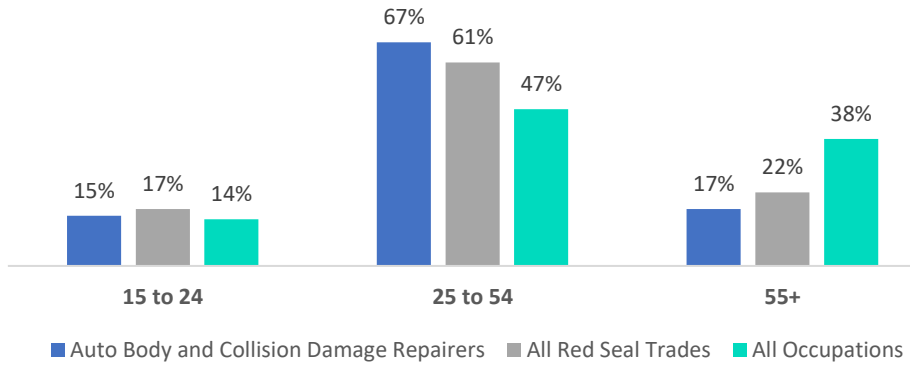

EDUCATION PATHWAY

Auto Body and Collision Damage Repairer is a compulsory trade in Ontario, requiring a Certification of Qualification, a Provisional Certificate of Qualification, or an active registered training agreement to practice within the province.

A grade 12 education is required to qualify for an apprenticeship.

The apprenticeship program is approximately four years, consisting of 7,280 hours of on-the-job work experience and 3 levels of in-school training.
