



## APPRENTICESHIP


Automotive Service Technicians perform preventative maintenance, identify problems, and repair vehicle systems.

This includes engines, steering, transmissions, braking, suspension, electrical and heating, ventilation, and air conditioning systems.

They may also work on trim and accessories.


