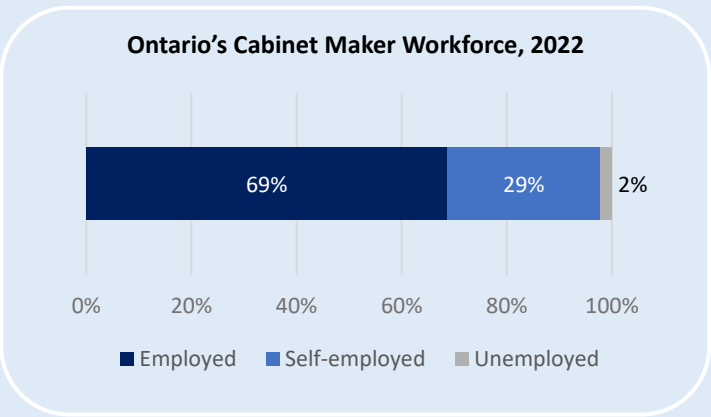


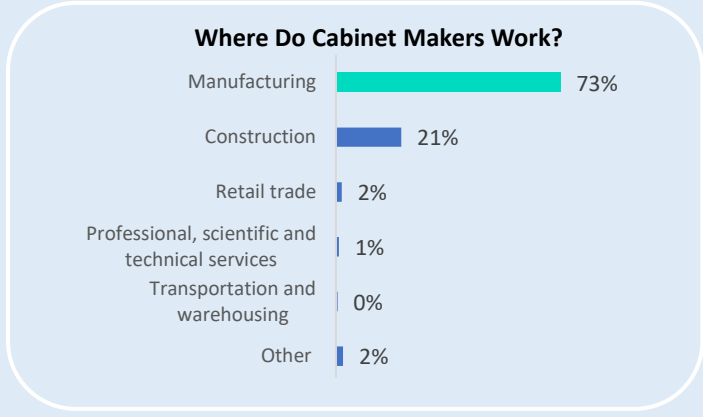
Cabinet Maker (438A)

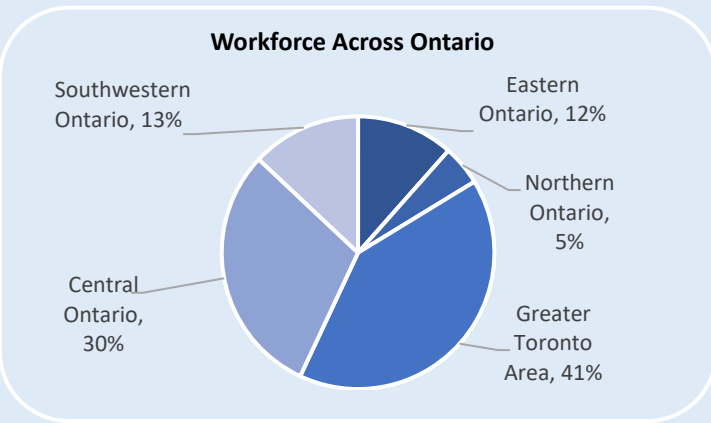

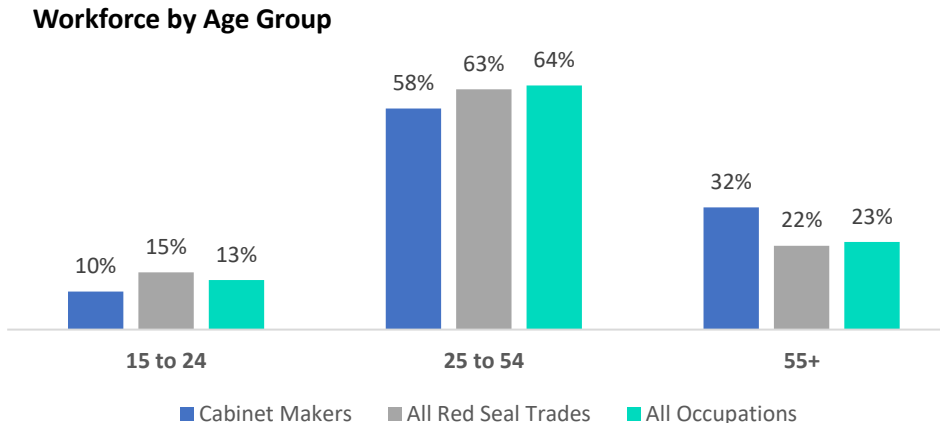

EDUCATION PATHWAY

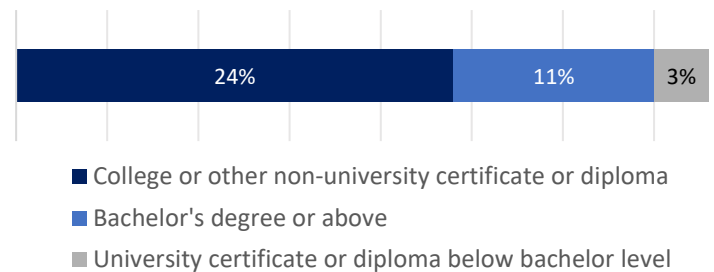
Cabinet Maker is a non-compulsory trade in Ontario, which does not require certification or registration as an apprentice to practice within the province.

A grade 12 education is required to qualify for an apprenticeship.

The apprenticeship program is approximately four years, consisting of 7,280 hours of on-the-job work experience and 3 levels of in-school training.
