



Heavy Equipment Operators – Excavator (636B) Number of Certificates of Qualification Issued, 2022




EDUCATION PATHWAY

Heavy Equipment Operator – Excavator is a non-compulsory trade in Ontario, which does not require certification or registration as an apprentice to practice within the province.

A grade 12 education is required to qualify for an apprenticeship.

The apprenticeship program is approximately one and a half years, consisting of 2,260 hours of on-the-job work experience and 2 levels of in-school training.
