Electrical Trades New Curriculum Implementation Summary:

Skilled Trades Ontario (STO), in conjunction with the Ministry of Labour, Immigration, Training and Skills Development (MLITSD), is replacing the existing 2003 Electrical Trades Curriculum. The implementation of the new 2023 Electrical Trades' curriculum will be phased in, starting September 1, 2024.

The table below provides a detailed breakdown of apprentice eligibility for existing and new curriculum levels during the phased-in periods.

Existing apprentices, registered before September 1, 2024, will have limited opportunity (based on the new curriculum phased-in implementation dates below) to complete existing curriculum levels under the 2003 program.

An apprentice (either newly registered after September 1, 2024 or an existing apprentice, registered before September 1, 2024) who takes the new level 1 program on and after September 1, 2024, will be required to take remaining new levels as applicable (levels 2, 3 & 4 for Industrial Electrician and Electrician-Construction and Maintenance and levels 2 & 3 for Electrician-Domestic and Rural).
