






EDUCATION PATHWAY

Plumber is a compulsory trade in Ontario, requiring a Certificate of Qualification, a Provisional Certificate of Qualification, or an active registered training agreement to practice within the province.

A grade 10 education is required to qualify for an apprenticeship.

The apprenticeship program is approximately five years, consisting of 8,280 hours of on-the-job work experience and 3 levels of in-school training.
