Recreation Vehicle Technicians work on the various systems and components of recreational vehicles, accommodation units, such as electrical, plumbing, propane gas, appliances, exterior and interior, structural frames, exterior and interior finishing components.

Experienced workers who have not completed an Ontario apprenticeship but have equivalent qualifications or experience in their trade can use the <u>Trade Equivalency</u> <u>Assessment Process</u>.




